

# YOUTH MADE

## Youth Making A Difference in Europe



The Youth MADE project supported young people to participate in youth exchanges to explore migration, share different views to develop informed opinions and gain respect for diversity.

Each exchange included 5 youth and 1 youth leader from each partner.

Activities included workshops, role play, debates, presentation, art work and the youth produced multimedia reports to disseminate their activities. By carrying out research and gathering information to develop their knowledge of migration, refugees, integration and inclusion they will have informed opinions and can become active citizens to influence their peers, their local community, elected representatives to lead to respect for human rights to prevent fear of others and radicalisation.

### The objectives of the project are:

- (i) to work with marginalised youth with economic, social and educational difficulties and engage them in all stages of the project
- (ii) for young people to be informed on migration, refugees, integration and inclusion and aware of different social, cultural, educational, economic and political realities
- (iii) to share different cultural views and propose actions to promote the values of solidarity, democracy and respect for human rights to prevent fear of others and radicalisation
- (iv) to encourage young people to engage in the democratic process – to encourage youth to participate in more international activities to develop their cultural awareness(v) to share the results of their activities through multi media reports online

The Youth MADE project will work with youth aged 13 to 30 from marginalised rural areas with economic, social and educational difficulties and involve them in all stages of the project to secure their engagement.

Through the activities they will develop key skills and competencies relevant to the labour market which will improve their employability.

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## France 22<sup>nd</sup> – 26<sup>th</sup> May 2018

The first youth exchange took place in Puget-Theniers, France and included 5 youth and 1 youth leader from each partner region from the 22- 26 May 2018.

The youth took part in a range of activities including moving debates, world cafe conversations, human library discussion with migrants and refugees and created presentations and produced multimedia reports to disseminate their activities. By carrying out these activities, researching and gathering information they develop their knowledge of migration, refugees, integration and inclusion and they will have informed opinions and can become active citizens to influence their peers, their local community, elected representatives to lead to respect for human rights to prevent fear of others and radicalisation.





## Poland 23<sup>rd</sup> – 27<sup>th</sup> October 2018

The second youth exchange took place in Bydgoszcz, Poland and included 5 youth and 1 youth leader from each partner region from the 23- 27 October 2018.

The youth took part in a range of activities to explore their views on migration integration and inclusion through discussion with migrants, movies and hearing from reporters who had visited and reported on the migrant crisis. The youth explored what it felt like to be a migrant and prepared reports and feedback on how migrants can be integrated.

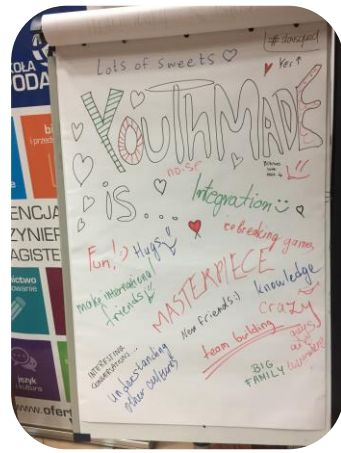


## Feedback
